



NUNAWADING SPECTRES TRYOUT GUIDELINES – 2021/2022

1. ATTENDANCE*

- a. Players cannot attend any try out session unless they have pre-registered. Due to Covid requirements, there is no ability to accept walk-ins.
- b. Each player/s will be required to check in / have their name ticked off by the coaches prior to the session.
- c. Players **MUST** report 10 minutes prior to the first tryout time for their age group.
- d. Once registration has been confirmed the player will be emailed their try out number. The assigned number will be the player's number for all tryout sessions and players must number both arms with black marker before attending each try out. Bottom age players require their number to be underlined – double-bottom age (U12 only) will need two lines.
- e. Players **MUST** wear their Spectres training reversible singlet or a light/dark reversible singlet, bring a drink bottle with name clearly marked and a basketball (size according to age group) with name clearly marked.
- f. Each **NEW** player **MUST** attend Stage 1 of tryouts (sessions 1 and 2) and if successful is then expected to attend all remaining tryout sessions and to be on time.
- g. If you will be absent for any tryout please inform Nunawading Spectres Representative Program Administrator Simone Hallett via email; jspadmin@nunawadingbasketball.com.au. As early as possible.
- h. To be eligible for final selections, players must attend all sessions unless they have notified the administrator of their absence. If players do not attend any session and have not notified the administrator, they will be not be eligible for final team selection.
- i. By attending the tryout session Friday 12 November, you are committing to the Nunawading Spectres program. No Permission to Train (PTT) can be requested from this date and only a clearance sought.
- j. Parents / guardians and spectators will not be permitted to attend tryouts.

2. SELECTION PROCESS*

- a. The selection team will comprise of independent Nunawading Spectres coaches.
- b. Evaluators will rotate courts so that they get to see all players participate in all types of drills and competitions. They will critique skills and basketball ability.
- c. Selection is subject but not limited to;
 - i. Tryout performance
 - ii. Player distribution – to ensure a quality and competitive team, the team may not for example, comprise of all point guards, once the coach has enough point guards his/her other selections will be focused on other positions/skills etc. Coaches will have the flexibility to select some players for specific positions/roles to ensure a balanced team, as well as considering team chemistry when finalising their team.
 - iii. Skills – Fundamental skills, technique, coordination, attitude, sportsmanship, intensity, competitiveness, performance under pressure, court awareness and scrimmage performance.
 - iv. Past performance – tryouts may provide an incomplete indication of a players skills, therefore input from a player's previous coach may assist complete the details on the players' ability.

3. NOTIFICATION OF TEAM SELECTION*



- a. Teams will be selected after all tryout sessions are complete.
- b. Coaches will notify players of their team placement via phone the Tuesday following the final tryout session.
- c. The maximum amount of time required if necessary to consider an offer is 24 hours. If there is no response from the player to the coach within 24 hours, the offer will be withdrawn.
- d. Players may decline an offer to play for a team. However declining results in that player being ineligible to play or train for any other Nunawading Spectres team in that season.

4. GENERAL INFORMATION FOR ALL PARENTS *

- a. Please review the 2021/2022 Player and Parent Handbook available via the Nunawading basketball website.
 - b. The handbook includes very important information regarding the program including many of our policies and procedures.
 - c. It is important that all parents and players understand that accepting a place in the program means abiding by all Basketball Victoria Codes of Conduct and Nunawading policies, codes and procedures as set out in the Handbook and/or published on the club website.
 - d. Tryouts are a stressful time for everyone, including parents. The tryouts are conducted fairly and everyone has an opportunity to display their skills. No pre-determined spots are guaranteed at any time.* There will be disappointments; it is inevitable that some players will not make the team that they thought they may make. Positive reinforcement rather than critiquing the tryout process or criticising other players will assist a player's development and help them to move forward. As we all know once the new teams are formed and have had their first training sessions, optimism for the coming season becomes the focal point.
 - e. IMPORTANT: we ask that parents do not communicate with the coaches during the tryout process in person, by phone, email or SMS.
 - f. If you have to notify of your child missing a tryout session please contact Nunawading Spectres Representative Program Administrator listed above.
5. **IN ADDITION;** If selected my parent/s and I agree to abide by all Basketball Victoria Codes of Conduct and Nunawading policies, codes and procedures as set out in the Player Handbook and/or published on the club website. If successful, I also agree that if selected my parent/s and I agree to be available for all scheduled VJBL Grading / Regular Season / Finals games and selected tournaments throughout the year. If selected my parent/s and I agree that I am required to register and play for a MEBA/GEBC Domestic Club. i.e. Saturday, Midweek or Senior Team in both Summer and Winter seasons
